What is Street Law?

Street Law is a phrase which originated from George Town University in the US and involves interactive workshops to make the public, including pupils at schools and colleges, more aware of their legal rights and responsibilities.

Workshops

Our workshops are often run via Teams or directly face-to-face. They are designed for individuals of the age 16 or above and are led by student volunteers and supervisors (e.g., legal professions or academic staff).

Any workshops delivered to children under the age of 16 must be delivered within a school setting and with tutors present from that school. The duration of each workshop is between 1 hour and 2.5 hours.

Our Objectives

- To empower local community groups to learn more about a particular area of the law that may be of interest to them
- To enhance knowledge and understanding of the law within schools and colleges, particularly in areas that may affect them
- To deliver public legal education in a format that can be easily understood and actively engages the audience.

Topics We Cover


Any area of law, including specific requests (this is, however, subject to resources available at the time of the request).
