

Investment

The university invests in the future in a number of ways. This includes investing in our equipment, systems, people, processes and buildings. There were a number of significant projects last year including:

- The new Beatrice Shilling Science Building – our new state-of-the-art home of the Department of Electronic Engineering, including a 268 seat auditorium was completed and opened in September 2018.
- The Emily Wilding Davison Building - Finishing touches were added to the new library and services centre which opened in September 2017,
- The George Eliot Hall – the last phase of work on these new student accommodation buildings was completed. This is their second year of use since opening in September 2017
- Physics Equipment – SuperFab at Royal Holloway, University of London is a world-class university cleanroom specialising in superconducting electronics and quantum circuits, and home of the UK Centre for Superconducting and Hybrid Quantum Systems (UK-CSQS). This was officially opened in April 2019.

In addition, a number of strategic projects were completed to improve the experience of our students and applicants:

- Our new website was completed and is now live, providing a streamlined and accessible interface for applicants, students and others interested in our work.
- We transformed our key student record system (Banner) to prepare it for some exciting new developments and for statutory changes that are coming.
- Infrastructure changes to Moodle and some other key systems were undertaken to ensure that the College can run smoothly
